# Mega Mustang Car Raffle



In the spring of 1964, Ford Motor Corporation introduced a new compact car, which may or may not have been named for the St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School mascot. Now, several decades later, we have launched our 16th annual Car Raffle, sponsored by Gene Butman Ford and the Butman family. The grand prize is a two-year lease on a 2012 Mustang Convertible, or \$10,000!

The Candy Red Mustang Convertible has 305 HP, a 6-speed automatic transmission, leather seats, a power folding top, the Shaker 500 audio system, and much more. This extraordinary pony has an MSRP of over \$34,000.

The success of this fund raiser is critical to St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School, so Ken Butman upped the ante with his grand prize donation, and he is challenging us to raise \$100,000. He has shared that the extent of his future support could well be determined by our efforts to meet that goal.

The school community has embraced Mr. Butman's really big challenge. Each family has been asked to sell 24 books of tickets (a \$480 value.) In addition, the school has invited parishioners to sell tickets to help meet the goal.

Over the years, the Car Raffle has raised an amazing \$1,050,866 for St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School, which has helped us maintain a quality education for our students, and keep tuition affordable too. The proceeds have also provided necessary school facility improvements (like air conditioning, windows, and bathroom upgrades) which have saved the Parish those costly expenses.

The school building is used by multiple ministries throughout the year (including Religious Education, Adult Faith Formation, the Common Conference, Vacation Bible School, the Homeless Shelter, and Stephen Ministry) so a financially successful Car Raffle directly benefits the entire Parish.

Please participate in this year's Car Raffle by selling a book of tickets, or by making a ticket purchase. In addition to the grand prize, there will be cash prizes of \$1,000, \$750, \$500, and \$250. Together we can meet Mr. Butman's \$100,000 challenge and help our school and Parish too.

## **Mary Lou Daby Spring Arts Festival**



The Mary Lou Daby Spring Arts Festival, which is held in May, is evolving, thanks to Cayla Samano, St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School's new art teacher. Ms. Samano is completing her first year at our school, and she spent a few minutes with the <u>Mustang Connection</u> talking about art and how she integrates it into our school's curriculum.

"My focus is a multi-cultural approach," says Ms. Samano. "Students are working across the curriculum on different art projects." She recently had second-grade students write Haiku poetry and create an artistic display for their works. Sixth graders completed a unit on aborigine art, including pattern creation. She also had fifth-grade students create maps, which required them to incorporate latitude and longitude, along with mathematical measurements.

Ms. Samano also works in art theory and art history for the students. "We learn about famous artists and styles, and the philosophies behind art styles. "I try to promote critical thinking and observational skills through art."

Ms. Samano tries to give students a broad art experience, saying that the Spring Arts Festival includes drawn and painted pieces, as well as clay sculptures, collages, multimedia pieces, wire sculptures, colored pencil drawings, pastels and a range of other materials. "Art is something you find in life; it's not a separate thing."

Ms. Samano says that she missed out on high quality art instruction when she was in elementary and high school, and wants to make sure that her students get the best possible exposure to art. "I'd like the students to leave St. Francis with a comprehensive knowledge of art movements, and a range of techniques – painting, drawing, sculpture, crafts – and a little bit of color theory," which, she adds, "can help them learn how to dress!"

Ms. Samano says that early Christian art provides a rich learning opportunity for children. "We've studied early churches, architecture, stained glass windows, and angels. The sixth-grade students recently completed a study of icons, too."

All students participate in the Mary Lou Daby Spring Arts Festival, and Ms. Samano includes a few new items of her own. This year the Festival features "Make and Take" tables, which students use to create new works of art "to go."

During the Festival, students sell their artwork, and guests enjoy refreshments and live music. Students also enter a raffle to win an art set.

Ms. Samano, who already has a Master of Fine Arts degree, is working on a second master's degree in Illustration, which she hopes to use to illustrate children's literature.

The Spring Arts Festival is named in honor and in memory of Mary Lou Daby, a past teacher and Principal at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School. Mrs. Daby was a firm supporter of the arts

This special pilgrimage to our nation's capital will include a performance during the National Independence Day Parade and a prayer service at the foot of the Lincoln Memorial. The festival will culminate in an extraordinary Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, with his Eminence Cardinal Donald Wuerl of Washington in attendance.

As Mrs. Opaleski said, "This festival will bring children together to sing for peace, and there is nothing quite like singing the Mass with children from around the world. Our students will experience an unforgettable journey, as well as the Catholic Church in all of its grandeur." Pueri Cantores is an international Catholic choral organization that provides opportunities for school age youth choirs from all backgrounds to participate in liturgical music.


