
welcomes thousands of new members into the Church through a process known as *RCIA: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults*.


The most thrilling, adventurous book of the Bible, *Acts* shows us Christianity being lived for the first time. It narrates the missionary journeys of Paul and his companions.

Our 2016 Parish Lenten Project for the Diocese of Kottapuram, India that totaled \$18,306.00.

As the diocese of Kottapuram undertakes many services, all offered to anyone in need, irrespective of creed or caste, the financial burden falls on the small Catholic community.

Here we publish a brief summary of the letter from Bishop Joseph Karikkassery and Fr. Nixon Kattassery, Executive Director, dated July-03-2016. Dear Rev. Fr. James, With much joy I send you a short narration of all that we could accomplish with the money which you have contributed. We thank you and your parishioners for being so generous and kind. Being aware of the great sacrifices that were made by you and your parishioners to get this money, I have been very careful in utilizing it for the most essential needs of our target group in The Kottapuram Integrated Development Society.

<u>Workers, especially those physically and/or mentally challenged workers, we pray, that all may find productive employment and earn fair wages for their labor. We had</u>

organized a one day orientation program with the theme of "empowerment of the physically challenged". Contrary to our usual practice of calling an expert in the field, we called two very young physically challenged women, who had been able to find their place in



Society, through struggles to come out from their nonacceptance by Society into a stage of self worth and dignity. One of them, Miss. Rixy Raphael, best Entrepreneur Award Winner of Kerala Social Service Forum 2016, who has problem with her leg, yet very good with her hands has learned handicraft and began her own boutique and now employing 20 women of whom only 7 are physically challenged. She is very proud of the fact that she is able to employ those who are not physically challenged.

<u>Children:</u> We pray, that all may find access to a quality education and be given the opportunity to become the best versions of themselves. During the month of May-June we have conducted a very special vacation camp called "Souhrudam" meaning friendship, for the children. The program aimed at bringing the best out of each child through interactions, playing together, dancing and singing together and also to bring the most intrinsic talents like cooking, acting, modeling, etc. Altogether around 600 children participated in the program which was conducted in 4 different parishes. The enthusiasm of the participants as well as the youth trainers.

<u>Cancer patients and family support program</u>: We pray, that all may be given the courage and resources they need to

live with dignity. We give a lot of emphasis on the care-taking of children of the cancer patients especially their educational and other basic needs, and also for financial support for the cancer patients. On 10th of June, we had a gathering for



the cancer patients and their children. The children were given financial support as well as study materials. Most of the parents were also present. During the program some talented children sang for the others. After the gathering, the participants were given tea and snacks.

<u>Family farmers and those who fish</u>: We pray, that all may improve harvests to support families, while preserving natural resources. Especially focusing on Youth and children Training programs in family farming, as part of the World Environment Day celebrations, we organized and distributed 2000 plants with a proportion of one tree for one child. Five schools were selected and we went personally with the plants and distributed to each child a plant. With great enthusiasm and with a promise that they will take care of the trees, the children received the plants. This program will be followed up coming months to see whether the children are taking care of the plants.

<u>Elderly</u>: We pray, that all may find access to healthcare and medical services. A general medical checkup like taking blood pressure is done every month with the help of nurses. After each gathering, a meal is served to all the participants. Each one of them wait for the day of gathering as they find it as an occasion to laugh and sing together, to share their joys and anxieties with one another.

In her poem "If You Have Nothing," poet and Carmelite nun Jessica Powers wrote, "The gesture of a gift is adequate." No matter what you have to give, it is the act of giving that is a gift unto the giver. As the Prayer of Saint Francis says, "It is in giving that we receive." To recognize the true gift we have to offer we need to empty ourselves, step aside, and see what God is offering through us. "If you have nothing," Powers concludes, "gather back your sigh / and with your hands held high, your heart held high / lift up your emptiness!"

TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 9:13-18b; Philemon 9-10, 12-17; Luke 14:25-33 (129). "Anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 5 Prayer works

In most countries, May 1, the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, is the day when workers are celebrated. In the United States, however, the first Monday in September is recognized as Labor Day. Ten thousand workers marched in the first Labor Day parade in New York City on Sept. 5, 1882. Today, let's remember all those who work, those who are unemployed and underemployed, and especially those who are not able to work due to disability or illness. Through the intercession of Saint Joseph, may those without work find hope and work, and may those with work find the joy of labor in all they do and strive to offer others the gifts they've received from God.

Hands-on holiness

When someone becomes your hero, you want to have a tangible experience of that person to capture and take home with you. So you go to the concert, attend the lecture, buy the book, see the play ten times. Secretly you hope to have a moment alone with this exceptional person, to get an autograph or selfie, maybe even to touch them-as if their specialness might be transferred to you by association. Jesus never invited this kind of celebrity from his followers. What he wanted was for us to realize that the Holy Spirit's power lives in us, too.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 6:1-11; Luke 6:12-19 (438). "Everyone in the crowd sought to touch him because power came forth from him and healed them all."

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 7 Be happy

The word beatitude comes from the Latin word for "happiness." God knows how much all of us want to be happy. In fact, as the Catechism says, "this desire is of divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart" in order to draw us "to the One who alone can fulfill it." In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus listed the blessings that lead to happiness. But they're not what the world considers blessings. The beatitudes are a revolutionary moral call. Not easy, but take heart, and follow the heart's desire.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Corinthians 7:25-31; Luke 6:20-26 (439). "Bebold, your reward will be great in heaven."

FEAST OF THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Seeing the light

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of the oldest Marian feasts on the liturgical calendar. Marking the birth of the Blessed Mother, this day is a celebration not only of Mary but of the gift her life is to our salvation. The Marian hymn "Mary, the Dawn" speaks beautifully of this relationship by declaring, "Mary the dawn, Christ the perfect Day." It is the light that dawned in Mary that is brought to fullness in Jesus. Today, as we celebrate her birth, let us hold high the gift of life, finding the Light in all we meet.

This villainy is still very much alive as human trafficking continues today. 




