Prayers to Know for Children in Grade 4

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." (Luke 11:1) Weekly in the classroom, your child will be given the opportunity to learn different types of prayers: prayers of love and praise of God; prayers which say I'm sorry to God; prayers asking for help; and prayers thanking God for His goodness to us. Special emphasis will be placed on the prayers listed below. Please pray with your child at home, encouraging your child to say these prayers with you.

1. ***Sign of the Cross.**
2. The ***Hail Mary**, Grace Before Meals, ***Our Father**, and ***Glory Be**.
3. An ***Act of Contrition**.
4. The Rosary including the Mysteries of the Rosary.
5. The Apostle's Creed

**Children will be asked to say the prayers in bold "by heart."* Children knowing these prayers will be able to choose from a number of prizes in the Religious Education Office.
