- We will suspend the *public* celebration of all Masses. Please remember that the Bishop has given a general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.
- Beginning tomorrow and for the foreseeable future Fr. Tony, Fr. Jose and I will celebrate our weekday and weekend Masses in private, in a closed Church, but we will *live stream* those Masses at the following times-

Weekdays Monday to Thursday at 9:15am
Friday at 8:15am,
Saturday 5pm Vigil Mass,
Saturday 7pm Spanish Mass
Sunday 10:30am Mass

- By live streaming we are giving you the opportunity to stay connected with our community of faith and to join us in prayer at this time of great difficulty and fear.
