PARISH OFFICE

- Communications with individual ministries should continue in the usual manner- these will be monitored remotely and we will try to respond as soon as practicable.
- If you have documents that need attending to-please drop them off at the Parish Office mailbox or forward them by mail/email to us.
- We will continue to publish a modified online version of our Parish Bulletin (Unfortunately, printed copies are not available). This can be accessed through our parish website.

MASSES and LITURGIES

- We will continue to live stream our regular weekday and our weekend Masses-5pm Saturday Vigil, 7pm Spanish Mass and Sunday 10:30am. *Please see the bulletin or our website for further details and for the times for online Holy Week and Easter liturgies.*
- The Church will continue to be open on weekdays for public prayer daily from 10am to 2pm. Special times apply to weekends again visit us online.
