Dear Friends in Christ,

In light of the current Corona-virus (COVID-19) situation, I thought it might be helpful to share with you the decisions we have made in order to protect our community, to comply with best current medical practice and the advice coming from the civil authorities. Hopefully, this will help us all to stay a little safer and to stem the spread of the virus.

Of course, we also recommend that everyone continues to exercise reasonable care by washing our hands regularly or using hand sanitizers. If you begin to feel unwell contact your regular medical provider and follow their instructions. As the situation changes, we will review these decisions but for the foreseeable future we are recommending the following:

SUNDAY MASS:

- That all our Seniors and those with any serious underlying medical conditions stay at home. *To assist them to continue to be part of our worshipping community we will live stream both our 5pm Saturday evening Mass and our regular 10:30am Sunday morning Mass.*
- Spanish Mass- *will be live streamed*.
- At our Weekend Masses we will continue to dispense with the Greeting, the Sign of Peace and the holding of hands during the Our Father.
- Holy Communion will be distributed with the Host only.
- We ask ALL communicants to receive in the hand.
- For those unable to receive Holy Communion we invite you to make a Spiritual Communion <u>https://www.ewtn.com/catholicism/devotions/act-of-spiritual-communion-339</u>
- No Children's Liturgy until after Easter.
- Sunday Coffee and Donuts is cancelled until further notice.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

• Holy Communion will be distributed under one form- again it will be given in the hand only. *Where possible we will live-stream these Masses so that all can continue to join us in our daily prayer.*

LENTEN EVENTS:

- The following Lenten Events have been postponed or modified to a simpler form. *Please note that our parish church will remain open for quiet prayer- a great opportunity to pray for others and for healing for our world.*
